What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the InvestNow Harbour Active Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Implemented Investment Solutions Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Objective: aims to deliver returns in excess of the Official Cash Rate (OCR) plus 5% over rolling 5-year periods.

Strategy: provides exposure to a diversified fund that invests in a portfolio weighted towards growth assets but with some income asset exposure.

Example of how this applies to an investor

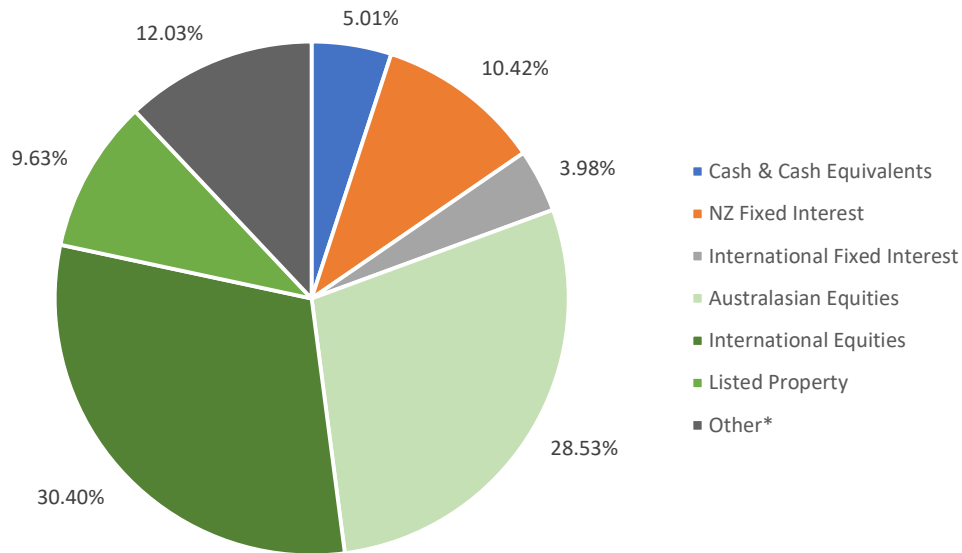
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund on the first day of the month following the fund's receipt of its first contribution, 1 May 2021, and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period to 31 December 2021, Anthony received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$550 (that is 5.50% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a total return after tax of \$543 for the period.

What does the fund invest in?

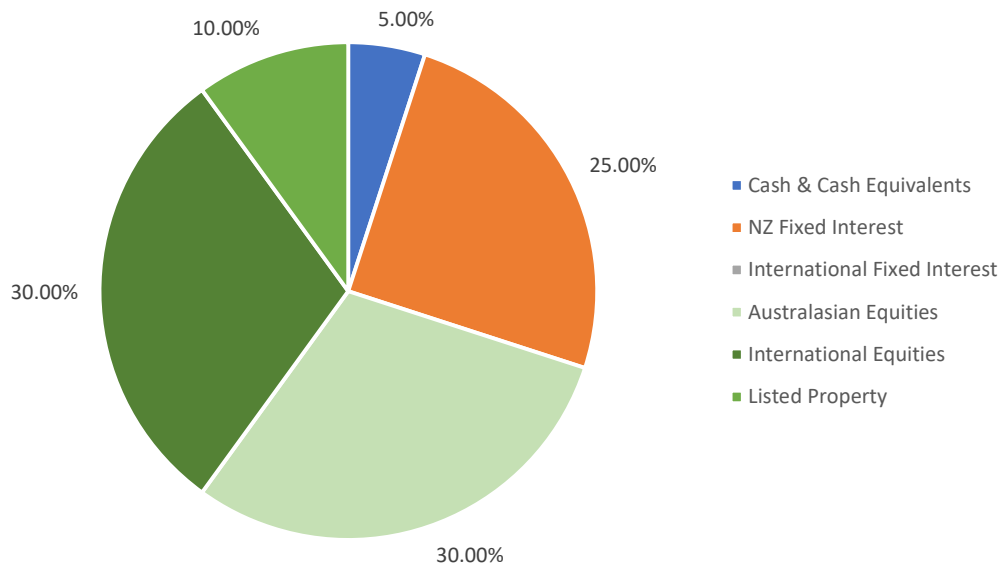
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

Notes

- A combination of actual fund returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the fund has not been operating for the required five years.
