What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the InvestNow Salt Sustainable Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. FundRock NZ Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

Objective: aims to outperform the Reserve Bank of New Zealand's Consumer Price Index +5% p.a. benchmark on a rolling five-year basis.

Strategy: provides exposure to a diversified fund with a mix of growth and defensive assets, with a focus on securities with strong ESG credentials.

Example of how this applies to an investor

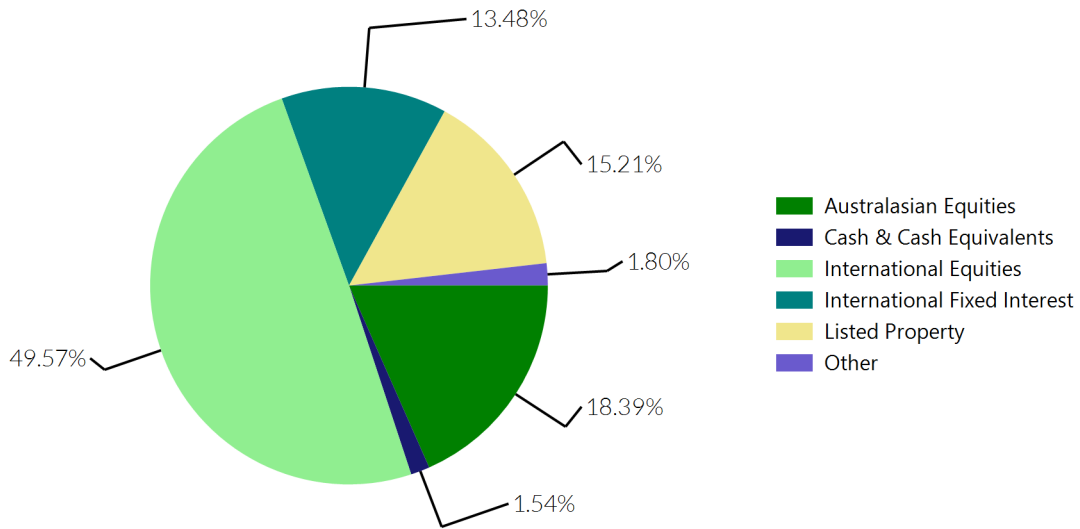
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Anthony had \$10,000 in the fund on the first day of the month following the fund's receipt of its first contribution, 1 September 2023 and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period to 30 September 2023, Anthony incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$425 (that is -4.25% of his initial \$10,000). This gives Anthony a total loss after tax of \$446 for the period.

What does the fund invest in?

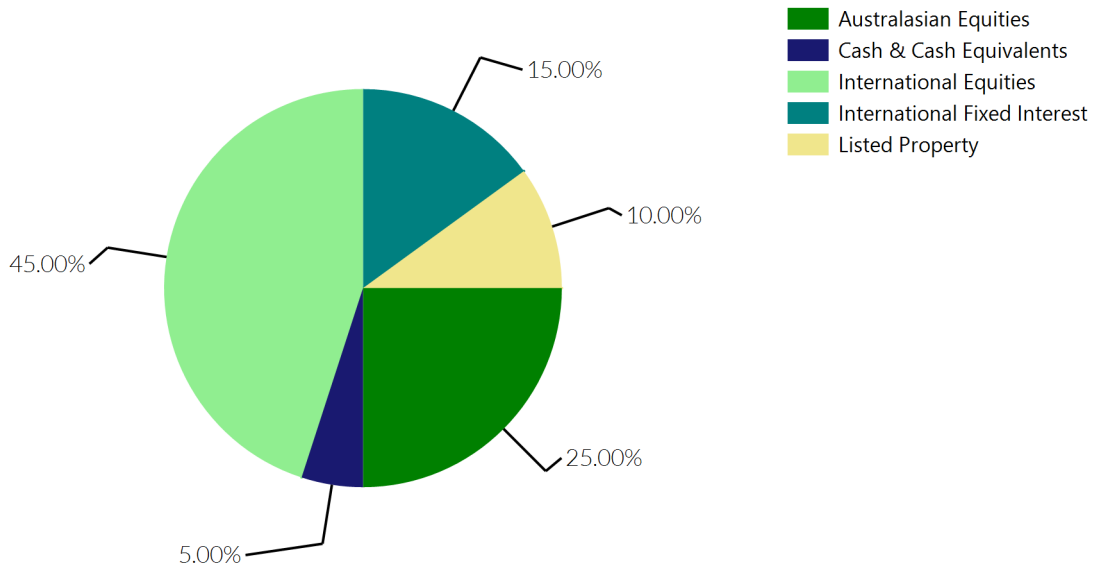
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

Notes

- i. A combination of actual fund returns and market index returns have been used to determine the risk indicator as the fund has not been operating for the required five years. - ii. As the InvestNow Salt Sustainable Growth Fund only started accepting contributions on 18 July 2023 historical fee information is not available. The fund charges represent our best estimates of the fees and expenses that will be charged to the fund. These have been estimated using information provided by the underlying fund manager and by reference to the underlying fund's disclosure documents.
